The University of Iowa Sports Medicine staff would like to welcome you and your staff to Iowa City and Kinnick Stadium.

There will be ice available to you in the ice storage unit outside your locker room. In your locker room you will be supplied with a hydrocollator w/pads, (4) treatment table, (3) taping tables, (2) IV poles and courtesy tape/first aid supplies. There will be a cold tub located in your shower area. If you need anything else, please request in advance.

Jennie Sertterh (Director of Athletic Training Services) will be available on your sideline to assist you.

Orthopaedic surgeon Dr. Brian Wolf along with general medicine physician Dr. Andy Peterson will be present should you or your physicians need their assistance.

Two paramedics will be located in the southeast tunnel to the stadium field. Johnson County Ambulance will be parked at street level in the southeast corner near Gate M prior to kickoff and in the southwest corner near Gate B of Kinnick Stadium after kickoff.

An X-ray technician is available and can be contacted through Jennie. Anyone going to the hospital for X-rays or care will need to be registered on the way there and transported via ambulance. Registration process will go through Dr. Peterson.

UIHC Emergency Room is located behind the Papajohn Pavilion across the street from Kinnick Stadium.
